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World Book Day

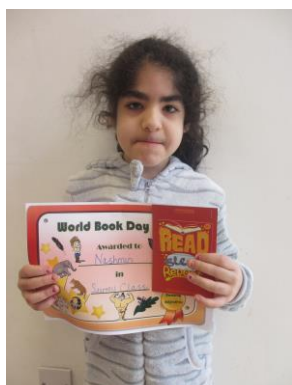

Nashmin R in Year 2 Surrey Class came to school in a onesie yawning to show how sleepy she was.



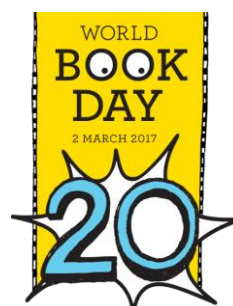
Abdulrahman E in Year 3 Cambridge Class came dressed as a hedgehog to portray the adjective spiky.

Rebekah H in Year 4 Dokuz Eylul was covered in cuts and bandages with a pretend pencil through her arm to illustrate the adjective gruesome.

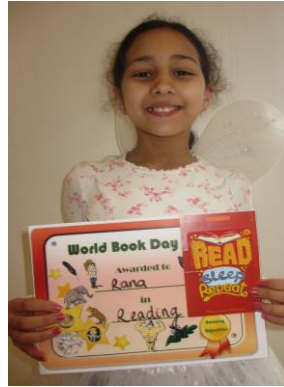

Naima Juid, who demonstrated the adjective loud, by using a megaphone. All day, she was blaring and deafening!

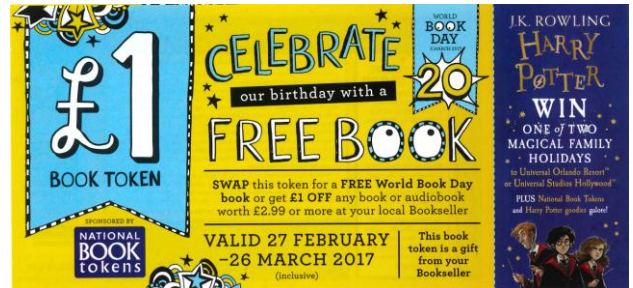


And Sam Gair, who was unrecognisably very mucky, filthy and grubby!

Transfer of School Nursing Services
