Congratulations to all the children in Year 2 and Year 6 who have completed their National SATs tests. Year SATs week was last week and Y2 has done their tests this week. All the children have completed tests in reading comprehension, English spelling and grammar, maths arithmetic and maths reasoning. All the children in Years 1, 3 and 5 have also been sitting Ark tests in English grammar and punctuation and Maths arithmetic. National tests results will not be released until July but parents will be informed about other recent test results in the next cycle of home learning workshops after half term.

## Crompton street parking



Over the past few weeks, we have received complaints from parents with children, our staff and visitors to the school and from members of the public about car drivers dropping off and collecting children. Members of the community have rightly requested the following:

- **Do not mount pavements in your car**
- **Slow down and travel at less than 10mph when nearing the school**
- **Do not block entrances with your car**

We work hard to make our children feel safe in school. Please help us to make our children feel safe at our entrances. Children and families should not have to walk around vehicles to get to our entrances, certainly if it puts them at risk in the road. The roads around the school are narrow and are not main thoroughfares, and therefore vehicles should be travelling slowly and carefully. All members of the school community and our neighbours should feel safe crossing the roads. If you live within 1.5 miles from school, you should be walking, scootering or cycling, not driving.

Well done to Years 1, 3, 5 and 6, which have had excellent attendance this week. The attendance of children in Nursery, Reception and Year 2 must however improve. The table above also shows the number of occasions children have arrived late. Well done to Nursery and Reception with only one late this week, this means only one child missed the important instructions at the start of the school day. Lateness impacts on behaviour, self-esteem and learning. The start of the school day is an important social time for children and it is harder to settle into learning when you are late. The impact of lateness on lost learning can be significant over a school year, as exemplified below.

5 minutes	3 days
10 minutes	6 days
